Senator Lundy is afraid of what it might lead to. Do you know there isn't a bill before us of all 715 of them that you can't make that statement about. If we pass this bill or that bill, it might lead to something else. It might set a precedent. Many bills we introduce do set precedents and we often in Urban Affairs hear bills, advance bills, that pertain only to metropolitan class cities, primary class cities. So I don't think, with all due respect to Senator Lundy, that that is a very good argument against this amendment. I would rather say one for all and all for one, and if we can help another county out, it behooves us to do so, and I would urge the adoption of this amendment. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Lynch.


SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. Chairman, members, I move that we adjourn until Monday morning, the 6th of May, at nine o'clock.
