

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I simply want to reflect the words and echo the words of Senator Beyer and Senator Withem about the City of LaVista because at one time I think they were predicting, in Sarpy County, that LaVista would be a ghost town. But that is not true. It is one of the most vigorous, forward-looking cities in Sarpy County and also I think in the state. I simply want to rise and speak about the 25th anniversary of LaVista. I also agree with Senator Withem, most of us will not be around, except him and some of these youngsters here. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, it is Monday morning but I don't think we should let these major kind of items slip through without comment. It seems to me like there is a rush to judgement today for this birthday greeting for this whelped pup of a community, LaVista. It's not even in the English language, LaVista. I don't know what language it is in, but it doesn't sound English to me. I'm questioning the resolution because this is a community who in its longevity and relative immaturity has sent Senator Withem down here, and I think if that is the measure of the town, I've got a question whether I'm going to green this resolution or not.

PRESIDENT: Hasta la vista. Anybody else wish to speak on this measure? Senator Beyer.

SENATOR BEYER: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, Senator Landis, I'll have to answer you. They were smart enough to get me redistricted out of there and give it to Ron, so see that helps, don't it.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on the LaVista resolution? If not, the motion is to adopt the resolution. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted on the LaVista resolution? Will you please record your vote. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of LR 91, Mr. President.
