Saying that, Mr. President, I would request that the resolution be withdrawn, but with the request that it be printed in the Legislative Journal. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there objection to the request? If not, so ordered. Thank you, Senator Barrett. Special order, LB 343.

CLERK: Mr. President, 343 was offered by the Business and Labor Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 17 of this year, it was referred to the Business and Labor Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are Business and Labor Committee amendments pending.

PRESIDENT: The Chair would first recognize the Speaker, Senator Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, I don't rise as Speaker. I simply rise as a member of the Legislature. I object to that being printed in the Journal. I don't mind a little fun myself. I just think it is out of place, inappropriate for this to be printed in our Journal, for us to be made the laughing stock of the State of Nebraska. I object.

PRESIDENT: Objection has been made to the printing of the resolution in the Journal, therefore, it will not be printed. The Chair recognizes Chairman Barrett on the committee amendments to 343.

SENATOR BARRETT: Thank you, Mr. President and members. LB 343 is a bill authorizing the Commissioner of Labor to require periodic wage reports, in other words to convert the unemployment insurance program to its present wage requesting system to a wage reporting system. The amendments to 343 simply clarify that wage reports would be submitted by employers on a quarterly basis rather than a periodic basis, changing one word essentially. It makes it more specific. The amendments were approved by the Department of Labor. I move the committee amendments.
