SENATOR HIGGINS: See, what raises my question about it is, why did they appear at the committee hearing as being neutral on it? If they have no interest here, I don't understand why they would even appear here.

SENATOR DECAMP: Well, I will explain that. In the original bill, the bill was neutral on the existence of Citicorp. Citicorp was determined to keep the bill neutral, remember, the original 147 or 157 page bill. Other parties in committee amendments changed the issue from neutrality to extermination or elimination or whatever you want to call it of Citicorp, and if that had been adopted, they would then have been eliminated. The amendments I am offering do not touch that subject whatsoever. It is left for other legislation, other times, maybe the courts, whatever, but I do not deal with that issue. Their reason though for appearing, as I stated, was because the original bill did deal with them specifically.
