CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to adopt Senator DeCamp's amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Is there anything further on the desk on the bill?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp, I guess we are ready...your motion is to advance the bill, Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, just one final comment, the financial industry has pretty well reviewed the bill. There were points in time in which they were in complete disagreement with some of these things. The fact that you haven't heard any opposition from them indicates I think they either recognize the absolute need to do some of these things or all of them or indicates at least maybe even their support. I think most of them are in support, and if you have reservations about the bill, sometimes you do what we have always done in here, you contact the people you trust most in a particular field and you check it with them. In this case, I would suggest you check with your financial people. The changes are indeed major. Maybe they will be copied by additional surrounding states. I think they will. I think they are going to necessarily have to do some of the things on bonding and property. But if you have reservations, do indeed feel compelled to check with the people that you trust most in these fields and check out some of these things.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance LB 653 from General File. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Senator Higgins.

SENATOR HIGGINS: A point of clarification. It was my understanding on the last vote that we voted on the amendment printed in the Journal.

PRESIDENT: That is my understanding.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Now, have we voted on those first amendments that Senator DeCamp advanced.
