

Chambers and Carson Rogers. You may call in your votes to the Clerk, if you wish.

CLERK: Senator Hefner voting yes.

PRESIDENT: We are voting on a Haberman amendment to LB 553. You may call in your votes to the Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Chizek voting yes. Senator Rupp voting no. Speaker Nichol voting yes.

PRESIDENT: Request for roll call has been made. Would members please maintain silence (gavel) so you may hear your name being called. The question is the adoption of the Haberman amendment to LB 553. Record the roll in reverse order, Mr. Clerk. Excuse me a minute. Senator Lamb, here he comes. I believe he is the last one. Senator Carson Rogers and Senator Higgins was here. Senator Goodrich. We should wait until we know that we have our full complement of unexcused members before proceeding with the roll call. Senator Goodrich, Senator Carson Rogers. Senator Goodrich is the only one missing. May we proceed, Senator Haberman? Go ahead with the roll call in reverse order.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2083 of the Legislative Journal.) 26 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. The call of the house is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Nichol would move to amend the bill. (See Nichol amendment on page 2084 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, my amendment is considerably simpler. The current law states that the mobile homes up to 16 feet in width may be moved upon the state highway system during day light hours. I'm not attempting to change that. The amendment I am proposing provides that when moving a mobile home upon the highway it may have an outside tire width dimension of up to 120 inches. Current regulation provides that outside tire width dimension shall not exceed 100 inches. The amendment does nothing to change the current requirement that mobile
