PRESIDENT: I take it that Senator Warner's proposal has been incorporated into the present amendment. The motion before you is the amendment offered by Senator Nichol. Have you finished, Senator Nichol, on explaining it?

SPEAKER NICHOL: (Response inaudible.)

PRESIDENT: Anyone else wish to speak? Very well, the motion is the adoption of the Nichol amendment to LB 553. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Please record your vote. We are voting now on Senator Bill Nichol's amendment to LB 553. Appreciate your cooperation in voting on the matter before you. If members would please give us your attention, the motion before you is the adoption of the Nichol amendment to 553. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Nichol's amendment to the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Anything further on the bill?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Warner would move to indefinitely postpone the bill. That would lay it over unless the introducers agree to take it up at this time.

PRESIDENT: What is the wish of the introducer? Senator Schmit or Senator Miller.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Should I speak on the motion?

PRESIDENT: The motion is to indefinitely postpone and the question is, shall it lay over or not? Take it up or lay it over?

SENATOR SCHMIT: I agree to take it up right away.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner will you present the motion.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I recognize that when Christmas occurs in May that it is very intriguing. LB 553 has been Christmas-treed pretty well. It's a very bad bill. Unfortunately, there are some things that were put in, like the last amendment, that had a
