SENATOR MARSH: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Madam President, members of the body, may I ask Senator Warner a question, please?

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Warner, would you respond?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Warner, if this motion would prevail, would you then support LB 122 if it came before this body before the session was over?

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Haberman, I've made it clear, I think, without exception each time you have come by that I do not support overweight vehicles and...

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you, thank you, you answered my question. What Senator Warner is trying to do here, folks, is he doesn't care whether it's attack this bill, whether it is a separate bill, he's going to oppose overweight permits, period, although the state highway department did put their stamp of approval on LB 122. So, therefore, I ask you to defeat this amendment. I brought this bill up and put my bill in here because harvesttime is coming and we need this bill for this summer. Quite frankly, I was afraid by the time we got to the other bill, which I had a lot of committed votes on and will still come back to those, but they can help me now, so I ask you due to the harvest, due to the importance of this bill to agriculture that you defeat this reconsideration motion and leave the amendment in the bill.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Lynch, you are now closing.
