I think everything that has been said is enough to cover, I think, the purpose of my amendment. I would ask your consideration for my effort to reconsider the Haberman amendment. I would also ask for a call of the house, Madam Chairman.

SENATOR MARSH: A call of the house has been requested. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

SENATOR MARSH: We are under call. Will those in the Chamber please put your green button on. Would those outside the Chamber please return to the Legislative Chamber. Senator Sieck, Senator Lynch, Senator Schmit, Senator Higgins, Senator Pappas, Senator Barrett, Senator Goll and Senator Goodrich. Senator Higgins is here. We are now looking for Senator Goodrich. Senator Goll. We are now missing only Senator Goodrich. Senator Rod Johnson, Senator Lamb. Senator Landis, excuse me, Senator Lamb. We are looking for Senator Landis and Senator Goodrich. Senator Higgins, for what purpose did you turn your light on?

SENATOR HIGGINS: Madam Chairman, for point of clarification. I've been out of the Chamber, as you know. I don't know what we're voting on at this time. Is it reconsideration of a bill, or an amendment, or which?

CLERK: Senator, we are voting on the reconsideration of adoption of Senator Haberman's amendment.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR MARSH: We are still waiting for Senator Goodrich and Senator Landis. Senator Lynch, we do not know where the two missing senators are. We are now ready to vote on the issue. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no on reconsideration. This takes 25 votes.

SENATOR LYNCH: Madam President, I'd ask for a roll call.
