SENATOR MARSH: It is my understanding, Senator Lamb, that we've reconsidered, therefore, it was not on the bill when he asked to have it withdrawn. Since it was his amendment, he has the right to withdraw it. I'd like to hear your perspective, sir.

SENATOR LAMB: Well, it seems to me that...is that right? It seems to me that we voted that on the bill this morning. All we did was reconsidered our action, but we did not actually take the amendment off of the bill, so it is still on the bill.
