

to that. I ask you what is going to come of coordination. There are other things the Department of Social Services does with regard to child abuse prevention, such as the ADC program and the rules and regulations relating to the ADC program. Shouldn't all these things that relate to child abuse, shouldn't they be coordinated by someone who is, in fact, in charge. Should there be a board out there that acts on its own regardless of what is going on on the other hand? I suggest to you that perhaps the bill is improperly structured as well as being suspect in terms of the use of the financing mechanism which is in place.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I'd like to ask Senator Barrett some questions, but he's gone.

SENATOR BARRETT: Yes, Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Senator Barrett, the reason for setting up the trust fund is so that we will not lose federal funds. Is that correct, Senator Barrett?

SENATOR BARRETT: Yes, I indicated to Senator Beutler earlier that without the trust fund section of the amendment we will stand a chance of losing the gifts, bequests and so forth, in addition to private money. I would answer also in this manner, who would want to...if we don't have the trust fund for the vehicle how is this money going to be given to the program? Will it be given to the general fund? Will the government want to make a grant to the general fund? We must have a vehicle.

SENATOR HARTNETT: And that is the purpose of the trust fund.

SENATOR BARRETT: That is the purpose.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Warner, then Senator Lynch.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I just wanted to make a couple of comments because they would relate to some that others have made. I've read...get the impression that there may be some who don't understand or don't appreciate, would
