PRESIDENT: Okay, you want the tort thing discussed separately from the cigarette tax?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Yes, the tort claim and the contract claim.

PRESIDENT: In your opinion, Senator Barrett, is that divisible?

SENATOR BARRETT: I might have some problems, Mr. President. I'm not sure that we can strip out...we're talking about the tort, the miscellaneous and the dedication of the cigarette tax. As a parliamentary...I think there may be a parliamentary problem there. However, I would add that I believe that there is another amendment forthcoming which may address the very thing that Senator Haberman is trying to handle.

PRESIDENT: So that that point could be discussed separately.

SENATOR BARRETT: Yes.

PRESIDENT: I think that, too, the interlineation of the amendment is such that it is very difficult to divide.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I'll withdraw it.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. All right now then, Senator Labedz. Is there discussion on the committee amendments? There are amendments to the committee amendments so I think we'll just go ahead with that, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first amendment to the committee amendments is by Senator DeCamp. Senator, this is Request 1292. It is on page 2041 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

CLERK: You want the latest...I've got three, Senator. Do you want the latest one? Do you want to withdraw then? Mr. President, then Senator DeCamp has amendments on 2041 and 2095 that I understand he wishes to withdraw. Senator DeCamp would move to amend, Mr. President, and that amendment is on page 2109 of the Journal.
