SENATOR HABERMAN: All right, then the debate is over. I'd like to have a call of the house.

PRESIDENT: All right. Senator DeCamp, you are entitled to close. You can close on your amendment, Senator DeCamp. Close on your amendment. Senator.

SENATOR HABERMAN: (Microphone not turned on immediately.) ...of the house, please.

PRESIDENT: A call of the house has been requested. The question is, shall the house come under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT: The motion prevails. The house is under call. All members of the Legislature outside the Chamber, please be notified that the house is under call. And all members in the Legislature, you are required under the call of the house rules to be in your seat and please record your presence on the board in front. Three members are excused at the present time. Will all members sitting in their seats please look up to the board and put your green light on to indicate your presence. Senator Chizek, Senator Higgins, Senator Hoagland is there. Senator Hoagland, record your presence. Senator Higgins and Senator Nelson, please. Senator Pirsch. Senator Lamb. Senator Chizek, Senator Higgins, Senator Pirsch and Senator Lamb, the house is under call. Please report back to the Legislature. Senator Pirsch is here. Senators Chizek, Lamb, and Senator Higgins is here. Senator Rod Johnson also. Senator Rod Johnson, the house is under call. Do you wish to begin the closing before they come, Senator DeCamp? The Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp for closing on his amendment. Before you start, Senator, let me repeat that Senators Lamb, Senator Chizek and Senator Rod Johnson are requested to come to the Legislature and Sergeants would see if they can make contact. Here comes Senator Johnson. Go ahead, Senator DeCamp, you are closing on your amendment to the committee amendments.
