CLERK: Senator Haberman, do you want to withdraw yours or...?

PRESIDENT: The call of the house is raised. Thank you, Senator Chizek.

SENATOR HABERMAN: At the present time I'll withdraw one, two, three, four, five. Are there any other amendments?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I'll pass over number six until a later time.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Beutler would move to amend the committee amendments. (Beutler amendment appears on page 2131 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Chris Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, my amendment to the committee amendment I will say quite frankly in the principle and in the main would strike the DeCamp amendment, but in addition to that it would provide for an alternative means of conveyance, that is, somebody had mentioned the fact that a mortgage or deed of trust was going to be used and wanted more flexibility and so we added the language, "or other suitable means of conveyance." But I don't want to be less than candid with you. I feel frankly that perhaps some of the statements that Senator DeCamp made in his closing on his amendments were persuasive with you, but I did not feel that his comments were entirely accurate and so I wanted the opportunity to make a few comments on his comments and to ask you to give serious consideration for this amendment which would, in its main feature, strike the DeCamp amendment. Senator DeCamp mentioned to you the resolution that we passed in January and he read to you parts of that resolution, but he read to you very selected parts of that resolution. Now I'm not standing here today and saying that all those who voted for the resolution in January necessarily have to vote for it now, you don't. Lots of things have changed, circumstances have changed, but I wanted to be clear on one point. The
