

over it we'll give you the one in ten and we don't admit liability. That's what occurred. What you're doing here is deliberately trying to lock the court into a position and then the court will have their excuse to jump off and play this game too and say, well, the Legislature made these specific findings, how can we look beyond the legislative facts? If you think these findings are accurate, fine, vote for them except that you did spend I don't know how many hundreds of thousands of dollars as a body checking these things out. You did specifically conclude otherwise and when you come in the bill and have such things as, for example, the advertising was misleading and so on and so forth. Go back and check the origins. It's exactly the same as the FDIC requested by the Banking Department because there was fraudulent advertising going on. And so we adopted the same policy as a body here that the FDIC still has today. At least be honest with yourselves when you're passing the bill as to the basis for it. Quit trying to make it so it's impossible for a court to judge honestly on it. That's all I've got to say.

PRESIDENT: Senator Harris, and then Senator Landis.

SENATOR HARRIS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, without presuming to characterize in the words that I would tend to characterize the regulation of Commonwealth Savings Company by the department, I will simply turn the balance of my time to Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, you have a continuum and on one end of the continuum is adequate and on the other end of the continuum is inadequate, and in voting for this resolution, Senator DeCamp, Senator Johnson, Senator Haberman point out that we have to make the momentous decision whether or not the oversight of Commonwealth was adequate or inadequate. Now I don't know whose jury is still out, but I can tell you for my sake I have no difficulty coming to the conclusion that the State of Nebraska was inadequate in its oversight in Commonwealth. Now for those of you who don't find any difficulty with what we did and our role in this, I'd understand why you would oppose it. It would seem to me to make perfect sense why you would oppose a resolution that said, hey, we didn't do a very good job in our oversight of
