Opposed no. Motion carried. The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, right before we move to 713, Senator Hefner has amendments to 153 to be printed. (See pages 2156-61 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, 713 is a bill that was considered by the Legislature yesterday. It is offered by the Business and Labor Committee. There were several amendments that were considered, some of which were adopted. I now have pending, Mr. President, the motion by Senator Haberman. Senator Haberman would move to indefinitely postpone LB 713. That would lay it over unless the introducers agree to take it up at this time.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barrett, as the Chairman of the committee, what is your wish concerning the layover or taking up at the present time. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR BARRETT: Mr. President, let's take it up today.

PRESIDENT: Very well, Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: A call of the house please.

PRESIDENT: A call of the house has been requested. The question is, shall the house come under call. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 7 ayes, 1 nay to go under call.

PRESIDENT: By that motion, the house is under call. All members of the Legislature, please record your presence at the front by activating your green light. Members outside the Chamber and all parties knowing where the senators are, please be informed that the house is under call and your presence is requested in the Legislature, unauthorized personnel to remove themselves from the floor of the Legislature, and members are to be in your seats during the time the house is under call according to the rules. Lowell Johnson, please. Senator Lamb, please record your presence. Senator Schmit, record your presence. Senator DeCamp, please, Senator Barrett, Senator Harris, record your presence. Senator Lundy, we need you in your chair to
