

everybody has for diminishing revenues, we're delaying the effective date on this bill. The bill affects the Family Support Program which was created several years ago, a very successful program. Part of the bill expands eligibility slightly so that there is going to be a need for some administrative cost to cover the work of identifying eligibility so it's about a \$19,000 cost to it. There is no reason that we have to have it this next year. There is no reason why we can't delay it a year to save that money, so this would delay the effective date of the act for one year and that is what we're asking you to amend the bill to do.

PRESIDENT: Is there anyone who wishes to speak on Senator Wesely's motion? If not, the motion is to return the bill to Select File for a specific amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. The motion is to return LB 87 to Select File for the specific amendment alluded to by Senator Wesely. Please record your vote. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion prevails and we are on Select File. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Again, this would delay the effective date on the act for one year. There is \$19,000 involved is all, but it would save that much money for next year.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Senator Wesely, why do we want to pass it at all if we don't need it until next year?

SENATOR WESELY: Well, we want to pass it because it deals with, besides the effective date on who would be eligible, that's what we're talking about. There is also another couple of items in the bill. One of them deals with the program has a sunset to it...

SPEAKER NICHOL: So you're not holding up the whole bill, just one section of it? Right?

SENATOR WESELY: Yeah.
