

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on the amendment? If not, the motion is to adopt the amendment offered by Senator Wesely to LB 87. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Wesely's amendment to the bill.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Move to readvance the bill.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to readvance the bill from Select File onward. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried. The bill is readvanced. LB 126.

CLERK: Mr. President, first of all I have amendments printed on page 2110 by Senators DeCamp, Wesely and Remmers. I understand you wish to withdraw those, Senator?

SENATOR WESELY: Yeah.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senators Wesely, Remmers and DeCamp would move to return the bill for a specific amendment. (Amendment appears on pages 2163-67 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely, are you handling this?

SENATOR WESELY: Yeah, I'll take it up first and I hope Senator Remmers and DeCamp might add a couple of comments. What was the page number on that other amendment?

CLERK: 2110, Senator.

SENATOR WESELY: Okay, if you'll look at 2110 that is essentially the amendment that is up. There was two things that Senator Remmers caught that what we're actually going to vote on is the substitute amendment, but the two things that are different, and that's all that's different are two things. It sets an effective date and it also has a sunset date on it, so that's the only things we didn't have in that
