

have seat belts that actually don't meet that standard.

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR VICKERS: And on the other hand, are we going to have a situation where a vehicle is going to have to be checked as to whether or not those seat belts are meeting that standard? I would hope that you wouldn't adopt this amendment because as I said earlier I think the bill is much more palatable in its present form. If you adopt this, I think you are creating a situation that is not only new vehicles because they are striking the word "new", they are talking about any vehicle that is out there, and there are a lot of us that are having to drive vehicles that are several years old and I don't think we really want those folks to have to put in new seat belts. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: (Gavel.) The Chair recognizes Senator Hoagland. Do you wish to speak on this motion? Senator Hoagland. I don't think I will need it. Thank you very much anyway. Is there further discussion on the motion? Senator Hoagland, I mean, Senator Schmit, do you want to close?

SENATOR SCHMIT: I have no closing, Mr. President. I just ask that the bill be readvanced.

PRESIDENT: No, I think that we are adopting the amendment now.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Okay, then, let's adopt the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to adopt the amendment that has been under discussion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. The motion is the adoption of the amendment offered by Senators Schmit and Morehead and Labeledz. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment has been adopted. Senator Morehead, do you want to advance?

SENATOR MOREHEAD: I would ask for readvancement.
