

SENATOR BEUTLER: And the other factors are delineated now in Section 6 of the Beutler amendment which we just adopted which should be on your desk and which I just recited to you just a short time ago, the caseloads, the distance traveled.

SENATOR SMITH: Yes, but you didn't finish that. You were telling me about that and you ran out of time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Senator Smith we talked about the caseload and the different kinds of....

SENATOR SMITH: Okay, I know you gave us that breakdown among the counties and so on, and you take all these things into consideration, but I don't think that...that I still see that my concern about distance, time, you did talk about the kinds of cases, the time that it takes. Is that where your times 5 and all that comes in there but you don't have a breakdown of the kinds of cases?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, if you look under subsection (a), page 4 of the Beutler amendment, and I will just read it to you, it says with regard to caseload, this is just one factor you look at. There are a bunch of factors laid out here but with regard to caseload you should take into consideration the number of cases filed, the number of reopened cases, the number of cases tried to a court...

SENATOR SMITH: I am sorry, I don't see that.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Do you have the one that says "Amendments to 516, AMO214?"

SENATOR SMITH: If that is what it is, I don't have that, okay? Okay, thank you.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Up on the top of Page 4 there, Senator Smith, you will see subsection (a)...

SENATOR SMITH: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: And already at subsection (a) we are getting into the factors that you look at and subsection (a) describes the caseload factor.

SENATOR SMITH: Okay, you went through all that but I am talking about other things that should be a part of that
