SENATOR BEUTLER: What is it that you have in your mind that you think should be part of this that (interruption)...

SENATOR SMITH: I am talking about the time that it takes for them to travel from one place to another, conditions that you might have out there that would affect their travel time, and a lot of other kinds of things.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, subsection (c) says the geographic area of each election district in order to promote accountability and equal access to the court by the traveling public, all right, and then it says the nature and extent of facilities and staff to assist, and if you want something more specific than that in terms of distance, I would be glad to put it in. That is intended to mean distance. If that is not enough for you, I am happy to put it in in the clearest terms possible because it is a factor that we have considered all along and should be considered and I want to make that as clear as possible. What was your other question, Senator Smith, I wanted to get back to that because...

SENATOR SMITH: My other question dealt with what was in, not your amendment, but the amendments which became the bill with the committee amendments, okay. No reimbursement shall be allowed for travel from the home of an individual judge to his or her primary service location or from such location to his or her home.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, that was put in at the request of western lawyers, by the way, and what they wanted, they didn't want a judge just located anywhere. They wanted to be sure that he was located in an area that was central to service in the area...
