

priority bill and he also pointed out to us that there are probably a number of Speaker priority bills that we will not get to this session because of a simple lack of time. I can assure you that LB 105 is going to take a considerable amount of our time because there are a number...

PRESIDENT: Can we have order in the Chamber, please. (Gavel.) It is getting a little bit noisy. Go ahead, Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Because there are a number of us who have some deep concerns about this particular bill, including myself. And I want to point out to you that I have these concerns as a grandparent. It might surprise some of you since I look so young and act so young to find out that I am a grandparent but I am, and I am only kidding you. The fact of the matter is I think this is a bad bill and I am going to do all I can under the rules to hold this bill up. So if we want to spend time this session and we will use this whole hour, I can assure you of that, and then I think we can come up with enough debate and enough amendments that this bill is not going to advance anyway if we are restricted to an hour's time. We can spend an hour of our time if we want to and wind up not doing anything or we can do the thing that I think we had ought to do. We can bracket the bill until January of '85 and...or of '86, and at that point in time spend as much time as this body deems necessary to deal with this particular bill. So with that, I would just ask to bracket LB 105 until January of 1986.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely, the Chair recognizes you.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Mr. President, I would just echo Senator Vickers' comments. I don't have any problem with the bill itself and I guess, you know, I did co-sponsor this bill in the past but I would rather just see us hold the bill over till next year. It isn't a priority bill. It doesn't have a need to be passed this session. It is not a major emergency so rather than take a lot of time, I think we ought to just hold it over and we will deal with it next year.
