

this situation where we are going to say regardless of what happens, regardless of how upset the children are, the grandparents are going to have to be able to go to court, and if the judge is like a lot of the members of this body who is a grandparent himself, do you think it is going to be difficult for the judge to say, well, you know, for the best interests of the children the grandparents had ought to be able to see them? These types of things can happen to some degree already. But we can discuss that more with the bill if that is the wishes of this body. If you really want to spend this time, and I will tell you, I thought we were elected to come down here and debate issues and I don't have any qualms at all in debating this issue and throwing up amendments till we won't even take a vote on it in this hour. It doesn't bother me. That is what we were elected and sent down here for. We spend a lot of time on a lot of issues that maybe aren't that important to a lot of folks in this state, as Senator Labeledz says. There is a lot of high priority to other people for different issues, that is true. And there is nothing wrong with spending time and debate on it. If that is what you want to do, if you want to debate this for an hour, fine. I only put this motion up to suggest to you that since this wasn't a priority bill, since nobody thought it wasn't...even Senator Johnson didn't think it was an important enough issue to designate it a priority bill or get the Speaker to designate it a priority bill, suddenly now everybody says, well, this is a real important issue and we have got to deal with it. I thought that is what our priority bill system was all about. I thought that is the reason we had a priority bill system. But undoubtedly that is not necessarily the case. So if you want to spend time with it, fine, vote against the bracket motion and then we will continue to debate until ten forty-two. Thank you, Mr. President.
