

Record the vote, Mr. Clerk. Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Mr. President, we only need a simple majority since this is an amendment to a committee amendment. Is that right?

PRESIDENT: That is correct.

Senator Warner voting yes. Senator Pappas voting no. Senator Eret voting no. Senator Hannibal voting yes. Senator...I got you, Senator Warner. Senator Beyer voting yes. Senator Nichol voting no. Senator Hefner voting yes...voting no, excuse me, Senator. Senator Conway voting yes. Senator Barrett voting no. Senator Baack voting yes. Senator Lundy voting no. Senator Carsten voting no.

PRESIDENT: Have all members recorded your presence on the board? The house is under call. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Have all members voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.
