SENATOR NELSON: All right. Excuse me.

PRESIDENT: If your motion is withdrawn, it is withdrawn. You may have...you may do that. There is another motion on the desk here.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp would move that 280A become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor.
