SENATOR HIGGINS: Mr. Chairman, I ask for a specific reason. Originally you announced this takes a simple majority. Is that correct?

PRESIDENT: Correct.

SENATOR HIGGINS: It is not an Appropriations bill?

PRESIDENT: No.

SENATOR HIGGINS: So it's simple majority.
