If there is a problem with that, I will certainly come back here at a later time as soon as we have had a chance to digest it and make any amendment that is necessary. But the main thrust of my amendment is to make this commission an advisory commission and the Legislature then can adopt or modify those recommendations. I think it is a logical way to go. It is the best thing we can do at this point this late in the session. What will I do in regard to the bill if this amendment is adopted? I will vote to adopt the...if this amendment is adopted, I will vote to adopt the Beutler amendment and advance the bill. I think it is a good way to go. It is the logical way to go and I ask that you adopt the amendment.

SENATOR SMITH: Mr. President, might I just ask for a little clarification here? Is it my understanding that in addition to establishing an advisory committee, that Senator Lamb would also be striking Section 7 of the bill?

PRESIDENT: For clarification.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Smith, I am not sure exactly what Section 7 would do. If it...all I am interested in doing is what I said. You know, I am not sure. This was drafted hurriedly. I am not interested in doing anything except making this commission advisory and that is all I can say at this point.

SENATOR SMITH: So then your amendment does not include striking Section 7?

PRESIDENT: The debate is closed. I believe the clarification has been made. The motion is the adoption of the Lamb...yes.
