

night, living in their vehicle, that would still be illegal, wouldn't it?

SENATOR SIECK: It would if the public park doesn't give permission. In some public parks there is permission granted to have alcohol in the park. If that is granted, then it is not illegal. But...

SENATOR DECAMP: But it would still be illegal under your amendment, wouldn't it, or under your bill?

SENATOR SIECK: No, it would not.

SENATOR DECAMP: Why not?

SENATOR SIECK: Because it isn't on a public highway. If a public...now it says that right in the bill...in the law, not the bill, the law, that if the public park gives a permission, then it is not illegal.

SENATOR DECAMP: But if you were driving down the road in a motor home, a long one, so you were a long ways from the driver, hell, half a mile from the driver...

SENATOR SIECK: Uh huh.

SENATOR DECAMP: ...and a couple guys were sitting there playing cards, not gambling, of course, because that would be illegal too, but just playing regular cards, Old Maid, and they happened to have a Coors, that would be illegal then.

SENATOR SIECK: It is now.

SENATOR DECAMP: No, it is not now, I think.

SENATOR SIECK: On the public highway it is.

SENATOR DECAMP: Well, maybe we ought to be using this bill to change it to legalize it. Okay, I get the idea.

SPEAKER NICHOL: No other lights. Senator Sieck, would you like to close on your amendment to the amendment?

SENATOR SIECK: Yes. In order to make this a good bill, we need to have this wording in it. If we take the...if we
