SENATOR CHAMBERS: So on any of those areas you could have an open container?

SENATOR SIECK: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you would not violate this law at any rate. All right, now in subsection (a) where it says in the original unopened package, what kind of liquor comes in a package? I don't drink liquor so I am trying to get information.

SENATOR SIECK: I meant a six-pack. We were talking about a six-pack that would be opened and one of the cans would be then open. Even though it was out of the package unopened, it would still be legal to carry it. But if it out of the package and the seal is broken, then it is an open container.
