I don't think these people are drunkards. As a matter of fact, I think most of these folks probably have never been drunk in their life, but nevertheless, they carry that bottle in there, many of them believing and I think maybe for a good purpose that it has some value in kind of warming their innards up a little bit when they are out feeding cattle in the wintertime, maybe having one along in case somebody gets bit by a snake, something of that nature. I know people who even pour a little bit of whiskey down a calf's throat once in a while. Now that bottle in the glove compartment is going to be within reach of the driver of the pickup, I can assure you. Or they might even carry a jug of wine under their seat. They are not drunkards. They are not contributing to the traffic fatalities in this state but they are going to be illegal. I know people that even carry maybe a little bit of the same sort of liquor or brandy or something in the cab of their tractor that they are using for feed wagons and so forth in the winter time and it might even get out on the road once in a while. Senator Lamb, I think you probably know some of those up in that country. They are going to be illegal as well. It says motor vehicle. Now those of you from the cities, how many times have you saw somebody out mowing their lawn with a riding lawn mower with a can of beer in their hand? Now what happens if they drive that lawn mower across the street or across an alley? They are illegal. Is that really what you want? Is that really what you want? What about the fact that we have got a situation here with this law that is just like...I think it is even worse than the seat belt law, that says that if you are sitting in the back seat or if you are clear in the back of a van and you have got a can of beer in your hand, somehow or other you are contributing to the traffic fatalities in this state
