

SENATOR LABEDZ: Now I am really confused. When will you get arrested? When it is on the front seat?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: No, it says right here in the amendment that is stuck onto the front of LB 598, it says, "located within a motor vehicle accessible to the operator while the motor vehicle is in motion."

SENATOR LABEDZ: So if it is in the back seat, he can't reach back and find that bottle, so it is okay.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: If it is far enough in the...if it is over in the far corner.

SENATOR LABEDZ: And it is okay on the bus and it is okay in the van because the van...it is in the back of the van. It is not in the front.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: As long as it is not close enough so the driver has access to it while the driver has the vehicle in motion.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Okay, thank you very much.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Sieck. Senator Marsh, then Senator Pirsch. Senator Sieck.

SENATOR SIECK: Mr. President and members of the body, you are trying to find some real difficult situations here which could occur. I can assure you that no automobile will be picked up unless it is doing something wrong, such as Senator Rex Haberman mentioned, a taillight or something like this. But do you think that that individual is going to search his clothes to see whether he has got a bottle? No way. But if he is pixedated, if he is drunk, sure, he is subject to arrest because he is drunk. He is subject for a citation. But I would like to give you an experience I had this fall. I had a chartered bus. We went clear to Miami, Florida, and the driver was pretty concerned about the individuals. One of our individuals had a bottle and we could smell it. That bus driver said, if I ever catch you, we are going to throw that bottle out because I am subject to a citation if they catch me with that bottle in here. And that was a chartered bus. He was concerned that no drinking is done on that public highway. He was really
