CLERK: Mr. President, the Speaker would move to suspend Rule 6, Section 7(b) to permit consideration of bills bracketed for Final Reading on May 15.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You've heard the motion. We'll need 30 votes to suspend the rules so that we can read the lower portion of the Final Reading today instead of tomorrow. All those in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed nay. I'd appreciate your voting on the suspension of the rules motion. Thank you. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on the rules suspension, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion passes. We are ready for Final Reading, ladies and gentlemen. Thank you for your cooperation on the motion. Would you please return to your desks so that we can start Final Reading. The rules are suspended and we are ready to start Final Reading. Please return to your desks. (Gavel.) Ready to start Final Reading. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, on the first bill, Senator Wesely would move to return 213 to Select File for specific amendment. Senator Wesely, I understand that the amendment that you had printed, Senator, on 2206 you want to withdraw. Mr. President, Senator Wesely's specific amendment is on page 2230 of the Journal.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Mr. Speaker, members, the amendment before you, rightly or wrongly, is referred to as the Marienau amendment. "Senator" Marienau who works for Senator Barrett has worked hard on this bill and drafted a compromise piece of language that was offered on Select File by Senator Barrett and Senator Landis which was not taken up at that time. This is virtually the same language. I've got a statement of intent I'll read here in a second. We did find an error in the bill once we got it advanced. It's been around for two years and we found one word that had been changed and so we had to return it for an amendment anyway. So the thought was after considering it that the Marienau-Landis-Barrett et al amendment was actually better drafting. So that is what the amendment is before you. I've got a motion to return for that specific amendment.
