CLERK: (Read LB 102 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 102 pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 2273-74 of the Legislative Journal.) 45 ayes, 0 nays, 2 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 102 passes with the emergency clause attached. LB 154 with the emergency clause.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk. Senator DeCamp, you had amendments printed, Senator, on page 1907. I understand you want to withdraw those?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: I think the sponsor is moving to pass the bill over. I would object to it being passed over. It should be read today.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, there is an objection. Senator Chambers.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Conway would move to pass over LB 154.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, we'll pass over it. Oh, there is an objection. All right. Senator Conway.

SENATOR CONWAY: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, LB 154 today, which did come up by virtue of the...earlier than what we had expected and by virtue of the fact that we had moved early this morning to suspend the rules and have entered into this segment of the agenda, caught us a little bit unprepared. As some of you may be well aware that as the bill stands now there is...particularly a concern of mine is the provisions for the Lincoln race track which ultimately fell into a different standard than what they've been used to.
