SPEAKER NICHOL: I still have nine lights on. Senator Chambers, then Senator Vard Johnson.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, and Senator Higgins, I didn't have a bill that they laid over while I was gone. If I would have had a bill that was due to come up, it would have come up. See, I've been dealt with so shabbily around here that I have to be eliminated from the discussions of courtesy and so forth. So when you are talking...calling the names of Hartnett and these people, that is fine because you all are cut from the same cloth and it is clear that I'm an outsider. So I don't fit in that at all. But I'll tell you this much, on a bill like this when you have a strong-arm outfit like Ak-Sar-Ben I'm not going to be deterred from objecting to what it is they are doing. Senator Conway said that he had agreed to hold his bill so Senator DeCamp could offer Ak-Sar-Ben's amendment. That doesn't mean Senator Conway has a reason that grows from inside himself in terms of what he feels about his bill that causes him to ask for the delay. I'd like to ask Senator Nelson a question. Senator Nelson...

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Nelson.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...if "Queen" Labeledz, we have unofficially named Senator Labeledz Queen of Ak-Sar-Ben and Senator Hall, King, we want to change it around a little bit. Senator Nelson...
