SPEAKER NICHOL: I have been following the line as far as I am concerned. SPEAKER NICHOL: Your point is well taken and I understand the point that you are making. Perhaps that could be considered in the future. I don't know that it is part of our rules, though. I don't think it is.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, without arguing it one way or the other, I'm just asking, this would not be considered then, while you are in the chair, a changing of the Speaker's order?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes, I would say that is true as far as I am concerned.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That it would not be?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes, that's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes. Announce the vote, please.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to pass over the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, the bill is passed over. I would introduce some guests in the south balcony. I think some of them perhaps have left. Senator Beutler had 21 fourth grade students from St. Teresa's School in Lincoln, accompanied by their teacher. Are you folks still here? I believe they have left. Senator Rod Johnson has 19 students...19 fourth grade students from Polk Elementary School in Polk, Nebraska, accompanied by their teacher. Are you folks here? Would you please stand. Thank you for visiting the Legislature today. Thank you. The call is raised please.

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
