LB 87A, 356

CLERK: Mr. President, 87A, by Senator Wesely. (Read title.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Wesely, please.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. LB 87 is on Final Reading. We've held up the A bill to have that amendment adopted which delayed the implementation date, so there is no money in the general fund being expended through this A bill this year. I move for its advancement.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Any further discussion? If not, the question is the advancement of LB 87A. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. You want to change the number on the board, please, Mr. Clerk, 87A. Please vote. Ladies and gentlemen, please vote if you'd care to. I hate to beg you on each vote, but we do need to move along. Thank you. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance 87A, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: LB 87A is advanced. We will move on now back to Final Reading to LB 356, 356. Before we do I would like to introduce some guests of Senator Rod Johnson. There are five students from Aurora Elementary School, accompanied by their teacher. They are under the south balcony. Would you folks please stand and be recognized. Thank you. LB 356. We have a motion on the bill by Senator Chambers. Is Senator Chambers listening in?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers would move to return 356 to Select File for a specific amendment. (The Chambers amendment is found on page 2282 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers, you are on with your amendment to 356.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, this Legislature certainly is tricky. I thought it would take them until about four-thirty to get to this bill. But, at any rate, Senator Peterson and I have worked with all of the people interested in this bill. What it does is affect the penalty provision.
