SENATOR CHAMBERS: I move that LB 356 be readvanced to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You've heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced. Anything else on the bill?

CLERK: No, sir.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. We'll move on to 408 with the emergency clause attached.
