

provided in some of the operations that we see in Omaha and Lincoln really doesn't shed any particular light on it being an extravagant operation as we move from total gross receipts on any given occasion, moving it from \$8,000 to \$10,000. That small amount would make a significant difference, I think, to the people in my district who happen to be in an area where they...where three states come together as well as the reservation's freedom to function in those operations differently. All of these operations that I am talking about are, as Senator Labeledz alluded to, they are the church and the small organizations. I guess I am in a situation where I think that it may enhance and even help those in the Omaha area also to have that much more of an increase. Because any given night that the gross receipts were to get over \$8,000 under the current provision, which might just be one good fall festival type of evening for many churches and organizations, they would have to shut down their operations at that point and then would be operating outside of the law. But to move it to ten would be a significant evening but yet not be anything that is of any major operation to create any particular competitive difference. So, with that, I would just appreciate it if the body would agree to return the bill to Select and then attach this amendment.
