SPEAKER NICHOL: Any further discussion? The question is the motion to return. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays on Senator Wesely's motion to return the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is returned. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Again, I would move the amendment. They are Sections 7, 8 and 9 of LB 333, and the letter from Gina Dunning explains the need for them.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, you have heard the motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Wesely's amendment to the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The amendment is adopted. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: I'd move to readvance the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You've heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced. Anything else, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Hoagland would now move to return the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: He doesn't want that one?

CLERK: Neither one, Senator? Okay. I have nothing further on that bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, we can move on then, can't we?

CLERK: Yes, sir.
