SENATOR CHAMBERS: He pulls himself slowly from his seat to his full height of about five feet, seven inches.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: I haven't said anything on this bill at all. I want you to do it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, I'm only five, eight. Senator Hannibal, who is to enforce this law, should it pass?

SENATOR HANNIBAL: I presume law enforcement officials.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How many of those individuals do you think will have been automobile dealers prior to entering into law enforcement?

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Ford dealers or just automobile dealers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Ford, Lincoln, Mercury, Cadillac, Oldsmobile, Honda.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: I doubt very many.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you think, or do you have reason to believe that they have received training that would let them know what a seat belt looks like when it complies with this regulation that no longer exists, but did exist at one time?

SENATOR HANNIBAL: I...better repeat that question.
