PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Rod Johnson.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. President, I call the question.

PRESIDENT: The question has been called for. This time we have had 9 speakers on the bill and we have about 7 lights on. Do I see five hands? I do. I will put the question to you. Shall the debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. The motion is to cease debate on the Pappas motion to indefinitely postpone. Please record your votes. 25 votes are required for adoption of the cease fire. Motion is to cease debate on the indefinite postponement motion. If you wish to vote, please do so. Have you all voted? The Clerk will record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 3 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries and, Senator Pappas, you may use your five minutes as you wish.

SENATOR PAPPAS: I would like to ask for a call of the house first. I am going to give my five minutes closing time to Senator Vard Johnson.

PRESIDENT: All right. A call of the house has been requested. The question is then, shall the house come under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.
