PRESIDENT: Time is expiring.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Thank you. I would ask you not to kill the bill.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to indefinitely postpone LB 144 and there is a request for a roll call vote. Silence in the Chamber. (Gavel.) Roll call vote. The Clerk will proceed on the vote to indefinitely postpone LB 144. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote now.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2322 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The call of the house is raised.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to indefinitely postpone.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. What do you have on it?

CLERK: I have a second kill motion, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Chair would not recognize the second motion to kill today. I think it is out of order. It would have to be moved by way of reconsideration if anything. What else do we have on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Pappas, do you want to make a motion to advance the bill.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Yes, Mr. President, I make a motion to advance the bill. Debatable, right, correct?

PRESIDENT: It is debatable, and if you want to proceed, you have ten minutes.

SENATOR PAPPAS: I have ten minutes. Okay, fine, thank you
