CLERK: 25 ayes, 22 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Okay, it is still being reconsidered. Senator Vickers, on your motion.

SENATOR VICKERS: I would just move the adoption of the motion, Mr. Chairman.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. Senator Harris, did you wish to speak? Senator Warner, did you wish to speak?

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, as the body well knows, I have yet to have voted for the veterinary college because I do not support it. By the same token, as the body knows, or if you do not know, I will tell you, that as a matter of policy, a self-imposed rule, that I have never gone any other way than what a majority of the committee voted, Appropriations Committee, even though I disagreed with what that majority rule decision was unless I said so at the same time, and there has been a couple of times over the years that that has happened. On this particular issue which was on the list from the Governor's Office and which we did discuss as several of you have, I joined with five, at least, not to take it out and the principal discussion was that it all ought to be handled in LB 204. Now I appreciate what Senator Vickers is saying. I do not disagree with the fact that if 204 passes as written that the sections that previously authorized these positions or at least why the positions were created are repealed, but I still am of the opinion, and I think that was reflected of the majority of those in the committee, that it all ought to be handled within the framework of LB 204 rather than in two, three different issues. By the way, I will say the same thing from my point of view if 723 is attempted to be amended which I think there are amendments filed relative to the veterinary college. Again I think all of it can appropriately be handled in LB 204. By the same token if the majority of the body are opposed to continue the vet college, this is one clear way to do it. But I would be supporting what the majority of the committee recommended which was not to do it through this bill.
