

Smith, Senator Landis, and Senator Lynch. Thank you. Senator Higgins is the only one left. There she is. And a roll call vote and we are voting on the Lynch-DeCamp amendment. Mr. Clerk. (Gavel.) Senator Higgins.

SENATOR HIGGINS: I would just like to ask one question. When the Lynch amendment was originally introduced about an hour ago, and then Senator Smith got up and you remember she asked Senator Lynch some questions and she asked Senator Nelson some questions and she said I wish, you know, then she got cut off because she still wanted more answers. My light has been on ever since then and I was going to yield that time to Senator Smith. I have never shut my light off.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question has been called and they voted to cease debate.

SENATOR HIGGINS: I just would like an answer from you as the Speaker how come all the amendments we have been doing and all the talking, that light has not been off and I have not once been recognized.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Would you like to check the speaking order, and the question was called, and we did it exactly according to this...

SENATOR HIGGINS: Is my light on now?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes.

SENATOR HIGGINS: I have not shut it off since Jackie Smith got up to speak the first time and asked Senator Lynch (interruption).

SPEAKER NICHOL: But there were others ahead of you. There were others...

SENATOR HIGGINS: For all these amendments?

SPEAKER NICHOL: For this amendment (interruption).

SENATOR HIGGINS: For the DeCamp amendment? I wasn't called on for the DeCamp amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Did you rise?
