CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The resolution is adopted. Do you have anything to read in before we start Final Reading?

CLERK: No, sir, I do not.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Since LB 721, with the emergency clause attached, is a very long bill, I think about 20 minutes, isn't it, Mr. Clerk?

SPEAKER NICHOL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please.
