CLERK: Mr. President, I have motions on 389. The first is offered by Senator Lamb. Senator Lamb would move to return the bill for specific amendment which is found on page 2243 of the Journal.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, members, you will remember the other day Senator Haberman put on an amendment which, in effect, would require an elevator to charge storage after 10 days instead of 30 days. After a number of discussions between the people involved, including Senator Haberman, there is a consensus to take that back off. So that is what this amendment would do. It would remove the Haberman amendment in regard to the storage costs. I move that the bill be returned for this specific amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, we'll still have this bill on Final Reading before the session is over?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Pardon me?

SENATOR HABERMAN: We will still have this bill on Final Reading before the session is over?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Yes.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you. I endorse Senator Lamb's amendment. I have no objection to it. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Rod Johnson. Did you wish to close, Senator Lamb?

SENATOR LAMB: (Response inaudible.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is, shall the bill be returned for a specific amendment? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the motion to return the bill.
