

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is returned. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, I would move to adopt the amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, any discussion? The question is, shall the Lamb amendment be adopted? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 36 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Lamb's amendment to the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The Lamb amendment is adopted. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: I move to readvance the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You've heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced.
