SPEAKER NICHOL: The amendment is not adopted. Do you have anything else on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: I have a motion from Senator DeCamp to return the bill, Mr. President, for purposes of striking the enacting clause.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. Oh, we must readvance the bill first. Senator Beutler, would you like to readvance the bill? No. Does anyone want to readvance the bill? Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: I move to readvance LB 401 to Final Reading.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You've heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. Machine vote has been asked for. All those in favor of advancing the bill vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 15 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is advanced. May I introduce some guests, please, in the south balcony. Senator Eret has 45 students from the third, fourth, fifth and sixth grades from Chester-Hubell-Bryon School in Chester, Nebraska, accompanied by their teachers. Are you folks here? Would you please stand and be recognized. Thank you. Senator Rod Johnson has guests in the south balcony.
