

for them if we were to have a January 1 enactment date. I'll ask your indulgence on the return of both amendments. I believe there are 37 or 38 signatures on the first one. I'm sure there will be no problem with that. If there are any questions, I will be glad to try to answer them. If not, Mr. President, I move the bill be returned for the specific amendment which I have outlined.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator DeCamp, please.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, just to say this is a good idea and I support it, and let's do it quickly.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Pardon me, Senator DeCamp, I wasn't paying attention. What did you say?

SENATOR DECAMP: I said this is a good idea, let's do it quickly.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Oh, all right. Senator Schmit, would you like to close?

SENATOR SCHMIT: (Response inaudible.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the suspension of the rules to consider the amendment. All those in favor of suspending the rules vote aye, opposed nay. It takes 30 votes. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to suspend rules, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The rules are suspended. Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: (Response inaudible.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. The motion is to return the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. It takes 30 votes...takes 25 votes. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 0 nays on Senator Schmit's motion to return the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill is returned. Senator Schmit. Just a minute. Would you say that again, please.
