

forth that is currently in Nebraskaland will be discontinued. There was additional aid in the original bill for aid to library systems. All of that increase over the previous year was taken out, \$147,000. \$33,000 out of the Liquor Control Commission which was to add an additional inspector, primarily for wholesale houses. The Commission on the Status of Women was a \$10,359 cut, a variety of smaller activities that they had been doing. There was \$144,802 reduction in Kearney State. We had authorized seven new faculty to reflect additional enrollment. Excuse me, 13...11 I guess it was, 13 it was and we reduced it to seven, two of which would be funded from the general fund, the other five would come from cash funds. The net result is that. There was one position that was eliminated at Peru, \$24,000. University of Nebraska at Lincoln, a \$200,000 reduction in general fund, a like increase in their cash fund. That was from recalculation of additional tuition we could reduce the general fund by that amount. The State Historical Society did have an \$80,000 increase in their overall budget. That was reduced to \$40,000. It covers a variety of activities there. The State Patrol, the odometer fund division, it was...I mentioned earlier a portion of that funding, with a contractional relationship with the Attorney General's office, would go to the State Patrol, reducing the general fund by \$25,000 and insert cash funds instead. There was another \$82,000 reduced in the State Patrol which is the equivalent of three trooper positions, if they had full complement. The Department of Administrative Services, there had been an additional clerk position for purchasing, that was eliminated. Another one that was delayed, there was a proposal that this year would have required \$200,000 general fund appropriation together with \$200,000 next year which was to initiate and install a different communication system network that, in the long run, would have resulted in probably substantial savings, but we are delaying that start up cost for one year. There was \$5,000 taken out of the Equal Opportunity Commission which was a variety of things; \$10,000 out of the Commission for Mexican-Americans, same token; one staff position at the Department of Aging was eliminated at \$18,500, another was to eliminate the general fund financing portion of the Grand Generation that is a portion of the funding for that program through the Department of Aging in the amount of \$65,000. And I guess that is the extent of the amendments that would be voted on separately. I would move their adoption.
